



What is Class A+ recycled water?

- For domestic users in some estates in the South Caboolture and Morayfield areas, Class A+ recycled water is supplied via dual reticulation.
- Dual reticulation is when a property has two sets of pipes: one for drinking water and one for recycled water. Recycled water pipes are coloured purple.
- Class A+ recycled water can be used for garden irrigation, outdoor wash down, washing down vehicles and cleaning equipment. For a comprehensive list of approved uses, please refer to the table below.
- If your house is fitted with dual reticulation pipes as described above, you may be able to connect to the Class A+ recycled water supply.
- For easy identification, the Class A+ recycled water network is coloured purple. This includes water mains, meters, pipes, taps and hoses.
- If your property is fitted with these pipes and you would like to connect to the Class A+ water supply, contact our Customer Service Centre on 1300 0 UNITY (1300 086 489) and our Customer Service Officers will advise whether you are able to do so.

Approved uses for Class A+ recycled water

Is recycled water safe?

- When used correctly, recycled water is safe for all approved uses. Appropriate precautions must be considered when using recycled water.
- Unitywater's recycled water is produced and monitored to meet stringent quality guidelines set by the State Government.
- Class A+ recycled water is treated to a very high standard and is suitable for a wide range of uses, as detailed in the table above.

Precautions for safe use

- Follow the Dos and Don'ts listed in the table above.
- Wash your hands with soap and drinking water before eating, drinking or smoking.
- If you have customers, friends or visitors over, let them know of the precautions when using recycled water (i.e. the items on this sheet).
- Always ensure that recycled water fixtures (taps & pipes) are coloured purple and labelled with "recycled water", "non-potable" or "not for drinking" signs.

Environmental considerations

- Restrict the amount of water used to avoid ponding, and minimise runoff into waterways.
- Like our drinking water supplies, recycled water is a precious resource - please use it wisely.

First aid measures

- If you accidentally drink recycled water and experience any symptoms such as vomiting and diarrhoea, please seek medical advice.
